June 2020	Athena in Action Workshop for Graduate Student Women in Philosophy
	I worked as the graduate student coordinator for the June 2020 Athena in Action workshop, originally scheduled to take place at Cornell University. As such, I helped preparations for the conference, including working on the conference webpage and coordinating outreach to solicit applications. Due to the Covid-19 outbreak in New York beginning in the Spring of 2020, however, the meeting ended up taking place virtually, instead of in person. At the last minute, we had to pivot to an entirely online setup, which I designed the website for ( <a href="http://athenaonline2020.com">athenaonline2020.com</a> ). This website had to serve as the 'location' for the conference, and so I used multiple different features to approximate elements of an in-person meeting: member profiles, so that conference attendees could learn about one another; online discussion forums, to approximate the kind of casual group conversation that occurs around scheduled presentations at conferences; ways of 'announcing' information to all attendees, and so on.
